Kimba AH & F Rules

- 1. Membership for 2025 (includes gate entry) available at the Show Office.
- 2. Entry fees will be stated in each section. Closing time for entries are posted in the header of that section.
- 3. All exhibits to be on the grounds by the time stated in the head of that section. Exhibits are not to be removed before 4pm without Convenor's consent.
- 4. All exhibitors must retain duplicate portion of entry ticket and present this to convener or steward before removal of exhibit. Exhibits arriving after entries are closed may, by the permission of the Committee of Management, be exhibited, but not for competition.
- 5. All exhibits must be bona-fide property of exhibitors.
- 6. Exhibits in all indoor sections must be grown, produced or made by the exhibitor.
- 7. Exhibitors are not allowed to act in any way calculated to influence the judges in making their awards under penalty of disqualification.
- 8. No Prize money under \$5.00 will be mailed. It must be collected from the treasurer within 14 days. All remaining prizes to be collected from the treasurer within one calendar month of the show. Failing this, all prizes not claimed within 3 months of the show shall be forfeited to the show society.
- 9. Protests against awards must be lodged in writing with the secretary by 4pm on the day of the show, and be accompanied by a fee of \$5, which shall be forfeited to the funds of the Society should the protest be deemed frivolous. The Committee, whose decision shall be final, shall deal with any prize that may be withheld in consequence of the protest.
- 10. All convenors and stewards have the power to remove unauthorised persons from their sections whilst judging is in progress.
- 11. Every care shall be taken of the exhibits, but the Committee of Management will not be responsible for any loss or damage.
- 12. Any exhibitor giving a wrong description of his or her exhibit with the intention of deceiving or defrauding the Society shall be debarred from the privileges of membership and particulars of the case recorded in the Society's proceedings.
- 13. Any competitor wilfully breaking any of the foregoing regulations shall, at the option of the Committee, forfeit any prize awarded.
- 14. In the event of an equal number of points being received by exhibitors in vying for Most Points or Runner Up, a count back will be conducted. The recipient of the award will be determined by the exhibitor gaining most 1st Prizes, or, in the event of no 1st, or equal 1st, then to the most 2nd Prizes. If the points remain equal between two exhibitors, the addition of 1 point each for each entry exhibited for competition is awarded to those with equal points. If points remain equal two awards will be given. Where three or more exhibitors remain on equal points, after a count back, no award will be given.
- 15. It is agreed and declared that the Show Society shall not be liable for claims in respect of bodily injury to or damage to property of persons participating in any performance, game, contest or display involving athletics, acrobatics, military or equestrian skill or the use of firearms, missiles of any kind, explosives, or combustibles. By signing the entry form / waiver, the entrant is agreeing to these terms and conditions.

Rich Fruit Cake - Class 366

EXHIBITOR TO USE SET RECIPE.

- 1. Cake to remain uniced.
- 2. Cake to remain undecorated (i.e. no almonds as decorations).
- Competitors must ensure that their entries are delivered to the Show hosting the semi-final for the relevant Association either in person or by a representative at the time and place as specified by the hosting Show. No postal entries to be accepted at semi-final or state final level.

RECIPE TO BE USED

INGREDIENTS: 250g butter, 250g dark brown sugar, 6 eggs, 250g Sultanas, 250g Raisins, 200g Currants, 100g Dates, 60g Chopped Red Glace Cherries, 60g Mixed Peel, 60g Chopped Almonds, 375g Plain Flour, 1 teaspoon Baking Powder, 1 teaspoon Mixed Spice, 200 ml sherry or brandy.

METHOD: Chop fruits, mix together and soak in the sherry or brandy overnight. Sift together flour, baking powder and spice. Cream butter and sugar. Add eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add fruit and flour and lastly chopped nuts. Mix thoroughly. Place mixture in a well prepared tin (square) 19-22cm, and bake in a slow oven for approximately three to three and a half hours.

Hint: Fruit should be cut to the size of currants.

Genoa Cake - Class 367

EXHIBITOR TO USE OWN RECIPE.

- 1. Cake must not be iced. It may be decorated with almonds
- 2. It should contain sultanas, currants, cherries and almonds.
- 3. There is to be no restriction on the ingredients used.
- 4. To be baked in a square tin 19-22cm.
- 5. Competitors must ensure that their entries are delivered to the Show hosting the semi-final for the relevant Association either in person or by a representative at the time and place as specified by the hosting Show. No postal entries to be accepted at semi-final or state final level.

GUIDE TO PRESENTATION OF FRUIT AND GENOA CAKES

- 1. Cake should be cooked evenly all over
- 2. Cake must be well cooked right through no damp or soggy patches.
- 3. Fruit should be evenly distributed throughout the cake.
- 4. Fruit should be moist and clean.
- 5. Points to be deducted for: cake rack marks, burnt edges, pieces of paper, or foil which were not removed properly from cake, marks on cake from careless removal of paper.
- 6. Do not cut cake. All cakes must be cut by judge





LAUCKE/CWA SCONE COMPETITION

- Best variation of the nominated scone recipe using Laucke Country Women's Association Scone Mix.
- Savoury and Sweet scones are alternated for competitions. Please check the SA Country Show's website for this year's flavour. For 2026 Final – Savoury.






